
- The present perfect simple expresses an action in the past with a result now.
- It puts emphasis on the result.

### My parents have bought a new horse.

(When did they buy it? We don't know when; the time is not mentioned)

#### Jack has been to London twice.

(When? We don't know)



# Present perfect

- We use the Present Perfect to say that an action happened at an unspecified time before now.
- The exact time is not important.



# The structure of the present perfect tense is:

	subject	auxiliary verb		main verb	
+	I	have		seen	aliens.
+	You	have		eaten	mine.
-	She	has	not	been	to Rome.
-	We	have	not	played	football.
?	Have	you		finished?	
?	Have	they		done	it?



# Structure

<u>AFFIRMATIVE</u>	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE
I have played	I <u>haven't</u> play	Have I play?
You have played	You haven't play	Have you play?
He has played	He hasn't play	Has he play?
She has played	She hasn't play	Has she play?
It has played	It hasn't play	Has it play?
We have played	We haven't play	Have we play?
You have played	You haven't play	Have you play?
They have played	They haven't play	Have they play?

# **EXAMPLES**

- •I have seen that movie twenty times.
- •I think I have met him once before.
- There have been many earthquakes in California.
- •Have you read the book ,yet?
- Nobody has ever climbed that mountain.
- •A: Has there ever been a war in the United States?
- B: Yes, there has been a war in the United States.
- He has just phoned me.

- We use just when an action happened recently
   I have just eaten breakfast
  - We use already when an action happened sooner than expected
     I have already finished page 20
- We use yet when we think an action will happen soon

# Whose + possessive pronouns

- Use Whose...? to ask about possession.
  - Whose is the book?
- Use mine / yours / his / hers / ours / theirs as possessive pronouns.
  - Is the mp3 player yours? No, it's Jodie's. The torch is hers, too.
  - Is this yours? Yes, it's mine.
  - Is this Pippa's book? Yes, it's hers.

Object (Receiver/the description)



Possession (belonging to)



Who followed by verb

### Still + PRESENT PERFECT

It has the same meaning as YET but they are placed at different places in the sentence.

STILL is placed before HAVE/HAS

I still haven't visited London.

YET is placed at the end of the sentence

I haven't visited London yet.

- I've been waiting for over an hour and the bus still hasn't come.
- You promised to give me that report yesterday and you still haven't finished it.

It is often used with other tenses as well as the present perfect.

I've still got all those letters you sent me.
